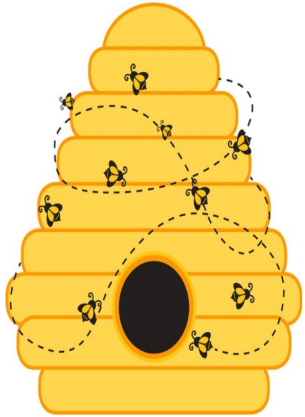


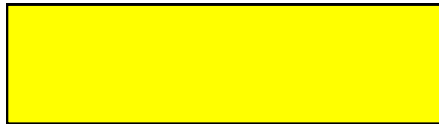
St Anne's Primary Behaviour Policy– September 2018

Amber– Name moved and a warning given



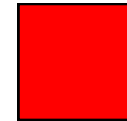
Red – no merit stamp on Friday.



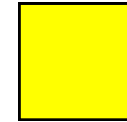
Black- referral to Mrs Rimmer/Miss Flint and a lunch time detention. If a child receives 3 detentions in one half term a meeting will be arranged with parents.

Whole Class Learning Behaviour

Each lesson will be colour coded at the end according to the learning behaviours of the class. Acceptable learning behaviour needs all children being actively involved during the lesson, appropriate conduct and good attitudes.



The class are not on task /behaviour is not acceptable
0 points



The class are working well together and conduct is good.
1 point



Outstanding effort in learning and excellent conduct.
2 points

The class with most points at the end of the week will receive an extra 20 minutes playtime with equipment.

Additional Rewards

Behaviour Points– Given in the classroom, around school , in the playground or for pieces of work. These are collected and certificates will be awarded accordingly.

Star of the Week– Awarded on Fridays for consistent good behaviour throughout the week.

Merit Stamps– Stamp received in Reading Record on Fridays to be collected and treats will be awarded at the end of the half term

Afternoon Tea– Cakes and drinks served with Mrs Rimmer.

Kindness Award– Certificates awarded every half term
