PARENT CONSULTATION

Please ensure that your child has appropriate clothes, red shorts – above the knee – and white T shirt only (**no football shirts or shorts**) to wear on PE days. PE kit should be worn with a school jumper. Children may wear joggers/leggings/tracksuits bottoms but please try to ensure these are plain in colour. Long hair must be tied up for PE lessons.
