# SCHOOL UNIFORM

Please ensure that your child wears the correct school uniform. School shoes should be worn on the days when they do not have PE. Children should <u>not</u> wear jewellery in school. The only exception is one pair of **small, flat, gold or silver stud earrings.** These should be removed and left at home on PE days. Please support us in this. Extreme hairstyles are not suitable for school. Hair bands worn by the children should be in keeping with school uniform.

## PICK UP AND DROP OFF ARRANGEMENTS

We also ask that masks are worn on the school site unless you are exempt due to medical reasons. These measures are helping to keep infection rates low and it is really important that we all work together to keep our children in school!

It is imperative that the area is kept as safe as possible for everyone and that driveways are not blocked as this causes inconvenience to residents. ## DECORATING WORK AND SCHOOL IMPROVEMENTS

Over the Easter holidays, we have had Year 1 and both the infant and junior corridors decorated. These areas are now looking fresh and bright and we continue to make improvements to the school building and outdoor areas to enhance the children's learning environment.

Planning has been approved to erect a permanent fence at the back of school. This area will now be fenced off, gated and new tarmac laid to provide a safe entrance area.
