

MFL – Spanish in EYFS/KS1

At St Anne’s we believe MFL teaching should be embedded across the school and we are committed to ensuring language learning is an immersive and progressive experience. In the EYFS and KS1, teachers share a Spanish rhyme or story with their class to expose them to other languages and cultures. Children then complete a small piece of work on the story or rhyme.

By the end of KS1 children will demonstrate they are able to:

- Perform the rhyme in groups/whole class
- Draw a picture of their favourite scene from a book
- Write a book review

To support the teaching of Spanish in the EYFS and KS1 we have collated a list of quality texts and classic Spanish nursery rhymes appropriate for the given year group. This overview gives each class a song or story to share with their class each half term.
