Only comment around teaching. After a disrupted start in Reception and lock down in Year 1, having split teachers for the return may not have been as effective. Both teachers have been great. This is just feedback.

In response to parents/carers not receiving enough information about progress:

As a school we offer parents' evenings in October and March. When the reports go out in July we also give the opportunity to meet with the class teacher to discuss progress. If a child was struggling significantly, academically or socially, we would always meet with parents to discuss this and would not wait until a set time in the year. We also try hard to use social media to highlight what the children are doing in school and the curriculum and class pages can be found on our school website. One of our school development priorities next year will be to further improve communication with parents. We hope to offer more face to face and online parent meetings regarding our curriculum.

In response to children having the correct amount of homework:

I was pleased to see that 94% of parents surveyed were happy with homework. Unfortunately it is one of those topics that divide opinion, with some parents thinking there is too much and some too little! Please remember that homework is not mandatory and that as a school we encourage children to complete work but it is up to parents to decide what is right for their individual child. We moved to online homework in an attempt to save paper and improve the process. Our intention was that it could be completed online and that there was no requirement to print out the sheets. We will continue to work on this and take on board the comments from the survey. From September we will try to ensure that homework can be completed online and that it is formatted so that it can be completed without the need for printing out. We appreciate your cooperation and support in this.

In response to children and parents/carers approaching the school with concerns:

Safeguarding at school is our top priority! Our school values and ethos are in place to support children in sharing any type of concern. We work really hard to develop relationships with both children and parents and it is pleasing that the vast majority feel able to approach a member of staff if they have concerns. We will continue to promote the sharing of concerns with the children through our curriculum, assemblies, visitors to school and specialist support service. Parents who have concerns can speak to the class teacher either at the end of the school day or by arranging a meeting via the school office. A member of the senior leadership team is always on the gate every morning to deal with any issues big or small!
