In Spanish this term, we have enjoyed International Day where we explored the cultures of different Spanish speaking countries. We created artwork in the style of artists Pablo Picasso from Spain and Beatriz Gonzales from Columbia. Science

Design Technology

product, making it and finally, evaluating how successful they were.

Year 6 have also become designers through their 'Make and Mend' project. They brought in old clothes and are in the process of turning these into a new product: a carefully designed bag for their chosen purpose and audience.

Geography

Reception have been finding out all about the 'Big Wide World', especially Africa where the story 'Handa's Surprised' is set. They've discovered lots of fruit that grows there; some of it they've tasted but other fruits are more unusual.

Did you know that there are similarities between our capital, London, and Peru's capital city-Lima? Well ask Year 1 who have become experts in this field. They've used aerial photographs to investigate and compare the two cities and the geographical vocabulary they have used has been amazing!

Year 2 have been studying the coastal town of Whitby. They have used geographical vocabulary to describe the human and physical features that can be found there and how coastal areas differ from other areas.
